Congratulations again on your acceptance to Northeastern University's Master of Science in Bioinformatics program in the College of Science at the Boston campus. We believe you're an excellent fit for this program and we are delighted to be working with you to help you reach your goals. To support your efforts, we are pleased to offer you the Academic Excellence Scholarship and the Early Application Scholarship.

Scholarships are highly competitive awards offered to our most promising candidates. The committee selected you as a recipient in recognition of your impressive academic and personal achievements and your potential to leverage your degree to create a difference in the world.

These awards provide tuition scholarship funding in the following manner:

Academic Excellence Scholarship

This award provides funds which will cover 10% of your total program tuition costs. Please note that this award will be disbursed as a percentage of actual tuition charged each semester enrolled. Also note that this award is meant for new Northeastern University students who enroll for the Fall 2026 term. Students who completed coursework at Northeastern prior to the Fall 2026 term are not eligible for this award.

Early Application Scholarship

This award provides funds which will cover 5% of your total program tuition costs. Please note that this award will be disbursed as a percentage of actual tuition charged each semester enrolled.

To estimate the total value of your percentage scholarship award, visit the current [Academic Catalog](#) and reference the *Program Requirements* section for your program to determine the minimum number of course credit hours required for your program. Next, visit this [Student Financial Services webpage](#) to determine the cost per credit hour for your program of study for the current academic year, using the following formula:

$$\text{Minimum required credit hours} \times \text{cost per credit hour} \times \text{award \%} = \$ \text{ total estimated value}$$

Scholarship funds are applied to your tuition each term that you enroll and will be reflected on your tuition invoice after the add/drop date of the term. Scholarships will be applied to your tuition based on program regulations and provided you adhere to Northeastern's Scholarship Guidelines (see below). When you receive your initial bill from the university, you may disregard the portion of tuition that is covered by scholarship funds, but you will need to pay any tuition in excess of your award, as well as all fees, by the due date indicated.

Scholarships are made possible in part through the generosity of our alumni, friends, and partners and reflect our longstanding commitment to providing outstanding applicants access to a Northeastern education.

To accept your scholarship awards, if you have not done so already, please confirm your enrollment by the deadline published on your applicant portal page. Scholarship Award Guidelines & Conditions

You received this award in recognition of your outstanding academic achievement, and it reflects our expectation of your continued academic success at Northeastern. Below are the guidelines governing your scholarship. Other guidelines from your college, department, or program of acceptance may also apply.

- Your scholarship provides funds that will cover the specified amount of your tuition reflected on your official scholarship offer letter, applicable only while you are attending classes as a Northeastern University student and while you meet the enrollment requirements of your program of acceptance.
- Scholarship funding will be applied only to tuition expenses and does not cover fees, the Northeastern University Student Health Plan, or other expenses.
- Visit [Northeastern's Academic Catalog](#) for official information on your college of acceptance's Academic Policies and Procedures, Academic Standing, or similar.
- If you receive the full tuition benefit of the Northeastern Faculty/Staff Tuition Waiver, or any other full tuition benefit from outside the university, you are not eligible for an additional scholarship or grant funds from the university, including this scholarship. If you receive a part-time benefit, you are eligible for university funds up to the total cost of tuition, including the Tuition Waiver.
- If you receive additional scholarship or grant funds from outside or within the university, your funding will be reviewed to ensure eligibility. Receiving multiple scholarships or grants may result in a revision to your award. You can find important information about the financial aid process on the Northeastern University [Student Financial Services website](#). If you qualify for federal student aid in addition to the merit scholarship funding you have been offered, Student Financial Services will notify you by email with an award letter.
- If you have questions related to your tuition bill, payment options, etc. please refer to the [University's Student Financial Services office](#) website. All other questions regarding your scholarship should be directed to your college of acceptance.
- Northeastern University administration reserves the right to make changes to these guidelines without notice.

For all scholarships **other** than Double Husky, Parent and Family, and Full Circle there are additional conditions:

- You are also required to remain continually enrolled each term (excluding summer terms) during the tenure of this scholarship (with no more than one noncredit term). Your CGPA will be reviewed at the end of each term. The scholarship will be canceled if you fail to remain in good academic standing. Academic standing at Northeastern University is determined by a student's CGPA.
- You will need to enroll in the academic term to which you were admitted. An enrollment deferral may result in a canceled scholarship, although you may be reconsidered for a scholarship for a subsequent entry term.
- Continuation of a scholarship is not guaranteed if you change the campus or program for which your scholarship was awarded.
- If you require a leave of absence, and your leave exceeds one year, you will forfeit your scholarship funding. Other types of withdrawal from the university, whether by your choice or through university action, will result in the forfeiture of the scholarship funding for all future semesters.
- Appeal process: If you lose scholarship funding for academic or other reasons, an appeal can be submitted, in writing, explaining the special circumstances to be considered. Appeals will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis by the Scholarship Appeals Committee. All decisions are final.
